Report

Council has recently constructed a new foot bridge on Park Road, Warwick.

On the 6 July 2019 Council called on the community to suggest a name for the new bridge with submissions closing on Monday, 15 July 2019. Additional submissions were received after the closing date, and were accepted and have been included in this report.

Council received 15 submissions for a new name. Copies of the submissions are attached.

The names that were submitted are as follows:

- "Coombes Bridge: in recognition of Linda Coombes for her volunteer work for the local community, bringing Parkrun to Warwick and supervising the district Parkrun.
- "Jamie Mackenzie Bridge" a most fitting memorial to him and his love for the region.
- "Graham Buchner Bridge" for his ongoing commitment and passion for both the community and road safety in our region.
- "River Walk Bridge" relevant to what and where it is.

Parkrun Warwick held its 300 run a few weeks ago and celebrates its six birthday in September. This totally free event encourages people of all ages to become active, through either running or walking or a combination thereof, our 5km course. It give them a purpose to get out of bed each Saturday morning and exercise, to help tackle the obesity problem that exists in society, but also provides them with a social outlet where they can come and meet new people. It is totally welcoming of people of all ages and levels of fitness.

Parkrun also attracts new people to town as there is often visitors from other towns who come and run our course. These people love our mostly flat course which takes us round our river. Most compliment our course and having this new bridge increases the safety of our course for both our runners, and also the general public who use this path.

Linda is currently a Territory, Event and Run Director for Parkrun which involves her looking after numerous Parkrun's all of which are voluntary roles.

I strongly believe that this bridge should be named after someone that has given something to sport in the area, given its location. He was passionate about the region not just his home of Killarney. He was one of very few councillors I saw at just about EVERY event in the area. He was always available for a chat. He was devoted not just to the region but the people in it.

Nomination for naming the Park Road Pedestrian Bridge

I hereby submit this nomination, to name the Park Road Bridge "Graham Buchner Bridge"

This bridge has been built for the community, and in particular to ensure the safety of the community. For many years Graham has showed ongoing commitment and passion, for both the community and road safety, in our region. He is a well-known, and highly regarded Citizen of Warwick.

In recent years Graham has been described as a "Warwick Institution", a selfless person who always puts Warwick first. He has had a long involvement with the community and continues to support and volunteer for several community organisations.

Graham has volunteered his time in the following ways:

- Since 1991 he has dedicated numerous hours, to slashing the grass on the sides of the major roads in and out of Warwick, with his own equipment, to keep them clean and tidy, ensuring that Warwick looks good for locals and visitors to the city.
- Volunteered, hours of work, and provided supplies, to develop the entrance to Morgan Park in 2000.
- Provided a fleet of mobile Event Vans, free of charge to clubs, Schools and events to enable them to have a venue, for administration and shelter.
- He built a 'People Mover' to attach to his tractor, to ferry people (adults and children) around during
 events
- He freely and enthusiastically commits his time, knowledge & resources to assist numerous community organistations, and committees, wherever, and whenever he can, including:
 - Warwick Senior Citizens
 - Warwick Chamber of Commerce
 - Warwick Show & Rodeo Society
 - Rainbow FM Community Radio (now known as Rose City FM)
 - The Cancer Council
 - The Warwick Leukaemia Foundation (Currently President)
 - > The Road Safety Group
 - Crimestoppers
 - The Motorcross Club
 - > Qld Trucking Association
 - > The Caravan & Motorhome Club
 - Relay for Life
 - > Rotary Club of Warwick Sunrise

Graham has also advocated for upgrades to the Eight Mile intersection and also for the region to become RV friendly.

I acknowledge, that in the past, Graham has been recognized for his contribution to the community, with individual awards, including an OAM for Road Safety, a Paul Harris Fellowship from Rotary International for exceptional community service, the Warwick Australia Day Citizen of the Year in 2017, the Warwick Chamber of Commerce Platinum Business Excellence Award in 2018, and most recently he was included in the 'Lane of Legends'. However, the naming of this bridge, 'Graham Buchner Bridge', would be a long lasting, and fitting recognition, of Graham's overall commitment, support, and excellent mentorship, he is unselfishly willing to give, to the whole community, within our region.
